

WPCA Legislative Update from George Klaetsch

Victory for WPCA Members with Commercial Motor Vehicles Item in DOT budget could have resulted in revocation or suspension

On April 30, the Wisconsin Joint Committee on Finance reviewed and took action on Governor Walker's Biennial Budget. A portion of the Transportation budget focused on the Consumer Protection Investigator Positions and Intrastate Motor

Carrier Regulation. This provision would have created eight new consumer protection investigator positions at a cost of hundreds of thousands of dollars. On a 12-4 vote the Joint Committee on Finance eliminated this provision from Governor Walker's budget proposal.

Why is this important to the WPCA?? Among other things, this provision would have done the following:

"Consumer protection investigators conduct motor carrier compliance reviews, which may involve on-site visits or other correspondence to examine the company's records and conduct interviews. Depending upon the extent of the issues under investigation, the review may take one to two days or up to several weeks. The purpose of such reviews is to determine the motor carrier's "fitness" to operate, which is a test of compliance with various safety regulations. If violations of motor carrier laws are found, the investigator may issue citations. Depending upon the type and severity of the violations, if any, the investigator may issue a rating upon completion of the review. If, as the result of the rating, the motor carrier does not take the prescribed corrective actions, the investigator may take action to have the motor carrier's operating authority revoked or suspended."

Important note – The WPCA has won the most recent battle, but not the war. While this is an excellent first step, the WPCA staff must still work with the both the State Assembly and State Senate to keep this unwanted provision out of the legislature's final version of the budget. We must also work to ensure Governor Walker does not reinsert the provision given his partial veto powers.



Legislative Session Reaches First 100 Days – What are the WPCA Lobbying Interests

In mid-April the 2013-14 Legislative Session reached its first 100 days. At that time, almost 300 legislative proposals had been introduced. In addition, a 1,083 page \$69.2 billion biennial budget was introduced by Governor Walker and his administration. As you can imagine, with that amount of activity the WPCA association staff along with the WPCA board has seen their workload dramatically increase (including the issue mentioned above). The following is a list (and brief description) of budget subjects and topics the WPCA has registered on behalf of its members:

Budget Bill Subjects

The Wisconsin Fund – WPCA has been lobbying to make sure the Wisconsin Fund is fully funded for each year of the biennium. As of this writing, Gover– nor Walker has proposed to provide \$2.3 million to the WI Fund for each year of the biennium – same as his last budget.

Electronic Plan Submittal (including POWTS)

As of October 1, 2012, The Division of Industry Services (Formerly Safety & Buildings) began accepting plans electronically. It was recently confirmed that POWTS plans are included in this electronic submittal process. Submitters are required to register for a SharePoint account logon prior to web-scheduling plans for the first electronic submittal.

To submit electronically:
