
WPCA Summer Conference Recap July 11-12, 2015 • Kalahari Resort • Wisconsin Dells, WI

Legislative Update: Executive Director, George Klaetsch

Wisconsin Legislative Budget Proposal Includes Electrical Changes to Septic Systems

For WPCA members that also install septic systems, you are aware of the electrical connections that are required to ensure a POWTS is fully operational and up to code. Most, if not all of you are also aware of a series of state legislative proposals and law changes over the past decade that created some interpretational concerns of what a septic installer could and could not do from an electrical standpoint. For those that don't, here is a quick history lesson on the changes.

- In 2007, Act 63 revised 101.862(4)(g) to clarify the scope of the exemption it creates for individuals who install manufactured equipment, utilization equipment, and manufactured systems
- In 2014, Act 143 amended provisions in 2007 Act 63, specifically to clarify manufactured and utilization equipment for a system



I am happy to report, that with the assistance of Assembly Speaker Vos, Representative Larson and legislative council, we were successful in drafting language that was included in the Joint Finance Committee version of the budget that amended 2014 Act 143 and created specific exemptions for septic and well pump installers to perform the minimal wiring for required for septic installations. This legislative change was signed into law by Governor Walker on July 12, 2015.

POWTS Code Advisory Committee to Reconvene on November 12, 2015

In early August, 2015 The Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) announced that the POWTS Code Advisory Committee would reconvene after a very long hiatus. According to the announcement, the committee would be meeting on November 12, 2015. This scheduling of the committee is positive news for the WPCA and industry stakeholders as the committee has not met for years.

The WPCA is represented on this committee by Bryon Wooten of Lake Shore Burial Vault. Wooten is joined by other like-minded industry stakeholders such as Alan Kaddatz representing the Wisconsin Liquid Waste Carriers Association and Sue Schambureck, representing the Wisconsin Onsite Water Recycling Association.

The POWTS Code Advisory Committee was created under Wisconsin Statutes 227.13 and 440.042 to advise the DSPS on matters related to the POWTS code as set forth in Wisconsin Administrative Code SPS 283.

Transportation Related Proposals Focus of 2015 Fall Legislative Session

The Wisconsin State Legislature will convene its Fall Floor Period beginning September 15 and adjourning on November 5. The primary point of focus for the WPCA will be on transportation related proposals. While more details on these bills will be covered in WPCA's fall newsletter, the two primary bills the association staff is focusing on will be:

AB 208/ SB 157 – relating to special restrictions cards issued with certain motor vehicle operator's licenses AB 209/ SB 158 – relating to commercial driver's licenses
