

Legislative Update: Executive Director, George Klaetsch

November 5th Completes Fall Legislative Floor Period

During the last couple months, the state legislature has been primarily focused on legislation affecting government and government reform. You may have been reading, hearing or watching coverage of your elected officials passing legislation to limit John Doe investigations, reforming the make-up and operation of the Government Accountability Board, as well as updating and modifying Wisconsin's campaign finance laws.

While some of that may directly or indirectly affect you and your business, the Assembly and Senate have passed two pieces of legislation that may affect you as employers or your employee drivers. Those two pieces of legislation are:



- AB 208/SB 157 Restriction Cards/Operators Licenses This bill eliminates the requirement for the DOT to issue special restrictions cards in addition to an operators CDL
- AB 209/SB 158 CDL's This bill makes a number of miscellaneous changes to the statutes related to CMVs. The DOT was compelled to make these changes to codify Wisconsin state statutes with federal regulations. Most importantly, this bill continues to allow the use of cellular telephones for a driver of a CMV, it ensures they are only permitted in certain situations. Those situations are:
 - Can still use phone if using the "hands-free" option
 - Can still use phone if answering or calling by pressing a single button
 - * Can still use phone if they maintain a seated position to reach / use phone

Sales Tax on Construction Materials for Tax Exempt Entities Passes Legislature – Awaits Governor's Signature

Another important piece of legislation making its way through the state legislature is Senate Bill 227. SB 227 would allow manufacturers & contractors to directly purchase construction materials on behalf of their taxexempt clients without paying the sales tax.

For some reading this article, that may sound familiar, and you are correct. You may recall, this past Spring, this proposal was included in the tax reform package of the State Budget Bill by the Joint Finance Committee and passed the full legislature. Unfortunately, a drafting error forced Governor Walker to veto it.

Immediately following the veto, State Senator Howard Marklein reintroduced the proposal to correct that error. Since its introduction, SB 227 has passed both the Senate and Assembly, and as of this writing, SB 227 awaits Governor Walker to sign into law. If the Governor signs the bill into law by Christmas, we will be on track to have the new law implemented for sales of construction materials starting January 1, 2016. All indications lead WPCA staff to believe that Governor Walker will sign the bill into law upon being messaged from the Assembly. Stay tuned. Upon Governor Walker signing into law, WPCA will work with like-minded construction trade associations to get certifications from the State Department of Revenue.

POWTS Advisory Code Council

The POWTS Advisory Code Council had their first meeting last week since being "mothballed". The primary scope or major objective for us will be to support a comprehensive update of the POWTS and Wisconsin Fund codes.

Any revisions to the codes may result in revisions to other chapters in the state plumbing code, specifically ch. SPS 381 Definitions and Standards, ch. SPS 382 Plumbing Installation, ch. SPS 383 Private Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems, ch. SPS 384 Plumbing Products, ch. SPS 385 Soil and Site Evaluation and possibly ch. SPS 391 Sanitation.

The POWTS code, ch. SPS 383 has not been reviewed since April 2000. New technological advances to treatment components and improved methodologies will be reviewed as they may or may not impact the current code.

Also, the funding tables for the Wisconsin Fund code, ch. SPS 387 as defined under s. 145.245 (7) (c) are to be revised when it is determined that 60% of current costs of a private sewage system rehabilitation or replacement exceeds the amounts in the current grant funding tables by more than 10% and will not be revised more than every two years. Those tables were last revised in 1999.


The Department of Safety and Professional Services is expecting input from the POWTS Advisory Code Council to utilize our knowledge from the groups we represent to develop the proposed rule changes.

Please review what changes, corrections or considerations of any new technologies and methodologies should be addressed that directly affect us as manufactures of these components. We will discuss this in detail at our winter conference meeting in January 2016.
